Tuesday, June 2nd

The Egg Protection Program. These are the instructions for the activity.

You are responsible for building a device that your egg will rest in so it doesn't crack when dropped from a height of 5 feet. Have a family member help you make 1 hard-boiled egg. When your egg has cooled draw a face on it. Give your egg a name. Keep your egg refrigerated until you are ready to test your device. You can involve your family in this project if they have time. Let's get started on keeping your egg safe!

1. Identify the opportunity.
2. Design your egg protection device. Brainstorm ideas, make drawings, gather supplies. □ Note: You CAN NOT build a "landing pad" to soften the drop. The only protection you can give your egg is the device you build to surround it. Your device cannot include pillows or clothing and must extend no more than 3 inches around your egg.
3. Pick a design and build a prototype of your egg protection device. Think about how you might slow the rate of descent, provide cushion, defy gravity etc.
4. Test your design by dropping your egg from 5 feet. Is your egg crack free after landing?
5. Tap to add to your journal.
6. Take a video or a photo of your prototype and the results of your test. How did your prototype work? Is your egg crack free? What was the biggest challenge? What would you redesign?

- **English Writing:** Pick one of the following titles and write a narrative story in your English Writing copy.
 1. Your Most Exciting Day at School
 2. Your Favourite School Trip Ever
 3. Zombie Invasion
 4. Power Cut
 5. A Dangerous Experience
 6. The Computer Character That Came to Life
 7. A Book Character That Came to Life

Narrative writing guidelines:

- **Structure:** It must be at least one page in length. Include a title so I know which topic you picked. Leave a space between each paragraph. Include at least 3 paragraphs- a beginning middle and end.
- **Beginning:** Include a “hook” to grab reader’s attention. Describe the setting where the story takes place. Introduce your story characters.
- **Middle:** Use the 5 senses to create atmosphere. Include action. Introduce a problem or complication.
- **Ending:** Try to solve the problem.
- **Punctuation:** Don’t forget capital letters, full stops, and quotation marks for direct speech.
- **Vocabulary:** Use powerful verbs and descriptive adjectives, not boring ones.
- **Structure-** It must be at least one page in length. Include a title so I know which topic you picked. Leave a space between each paragraph.
- **Proofread-** When you are finished, read back over the piece to make sure it makes sense and that you have used the correct punctuation, grammar and spelling. Don’t guess spelling; if in doubt ask someone or check it up.

Remember your story plan mountain on page 47 of Starlight. Every good story has an introduction, build-up, problem, fix problem and ending.
